FY 2025 Highlights

(July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025)

We continue to celebrate our long history of growing together!

For more than 40 years, we have been providing services and supports to intellectually and developmentally disabled (I/DD) adults so they can live the lives they choose as independently as possible. Our community farm has been a focal point for vocational opportunities and community partnerships for more than ten years.

We applied for mission-centric grants for the seventh year in a row.

- In 2025, state and local leaders showcased our renovated residential complex as a model of community partnerships. Maryland Senate President Bill Ferguson, State Senator Shaneka Hensen, and city and county officials met with staff and residents, then toured the apartment complexes.

- Thanks to ACDS, we completed the extensive, multi-year renovation of our residential complex, including patios and new kitchens. ACDS managed grant funding in the amount of \$1,700,000 to help finance the \$3.9 million project. These renovations continue to enhance the quality of life for the individuals in our care, encouraging community and connection.
- We received awards in support of our vocational programs and the Farm. These include, for example, new equipment, materials and labor to build sustainable structures, enhance our rancher, and funds to improve our Sensory Garden, woodland farm, performance and outdoor spaces, murals, signage, and plantings. We received cash grants to fund resources to deliver fresh vegetables to our group homes. In 2024, Sen. Sarah Elfreth (now a member of the U.S. Congress) joined us to celebrate our Farm's 10th anniversary. We continue to be grateful for such support from the wider community.
- Langton's reputation and visibility in the wider community continues to grow. The support of state and local leaders strengthens our reputation as a premier agency.
- We continue to innovate. In addition to our in-person activities and job supports, our Langton Learning model is an exciting virtual activity site (www.langtonlearning.org) for our community. Our staff developed a full slate of virtual activities—everything from cooking, yoga and travel tours to Farm visits. This makes it possible for the individuals in our care who choose a virtual option to learn and have fun together.

We dedicated ourselves to excellence and community.

- Our leaders are exceptional. We welcome new board members Jason Long, Michael Yates and Dave Schuler, and celebrate those like Michael J. Ragland, Sr., Esq., who received the Carol Thompson Lifetime Achievement Award, CFAAC's highest honor for philanthropy.

We foster independence and offer support along the way. We like to say, "Come grow with us."

- Our staff—272—participated in more than 2,000 hours of training—including 25 different kinds of programs.
- Staff are mentored and trained in support of our high standards—in fact, we continue to exceed the standards for our industry and have an excellent retention rate.
- Our new office in Gambrills, fully staffed in 2025, allows us to offer expanded in-person training to meet the needs of staff located throughout the county.
- Through our Employee Give-Back program staff contributed nearly \$13,000 to improve the quality of life for individuals at Langton Green. Since its inception in 2017, staff have donated nearly \$81,000 to this program. I am proud of our giving culture and our staff participation in 2025 continues to inspire me!
- Your generous gifts in 2024 and 2025 funded “extras”—so essential to quality of life for individuals in our care.

Our Community Farm and supported employment program is thriving!

- Your gift to the Farm’s Vocational Fund makes it possible to provide meaningful work for individuals at the Farm as the minimum wage increases.
- Thanks to ongoing support from a Nature Sacred grant and help from volunteers, we are expanding our outdoor spaces for performances and community events.
- We touch lives with our livestock and animal therapy program. Our Sensory Garden, a county-wide demonstration site, is thriving.
- We have continually harvested produce for 30 weeks. We are fielding hydroponic systems to continue growing and harvesting year-round for the first time ever. Of course we also collected more than 13,000 eggs!
- The individuals we support worked thousands of hours collectively —on the Farm and in the community —at competitive wages. Your generous gifts make this possible.

We’ve expanded our relationships with the wider community.

- Our volunteers work side-by-side with the individuals we support.
- Our produce has won blue-ribbon awards at regional agricultural fairs.
- Our Online Farmers Market is part of our commitment to fresh, nutritious produce that is affordable. Our growers donate surplus to community food banks, such as St. Luke’s Church.
- We’re sowing seeds through partnerships with Anne Arundel County public schools, senior communities, and local church youth groups —to name a few. Our Farm is a vocational education site for special ed students from Crofton High School.
- We’re creating a new “Mini-Farm” in our community garden so children can learn about local sustainable agricultural production.

As I reflect on our continued growth, the warmth and dedication of our staff, the spirit of giving in our community—and your generous support—are just as important as ever. Thank you for being there for us! We are grateful for your support! I look forward to seeing you at an event at Langton Green.

Our Fiscal Fitness Adds Up...

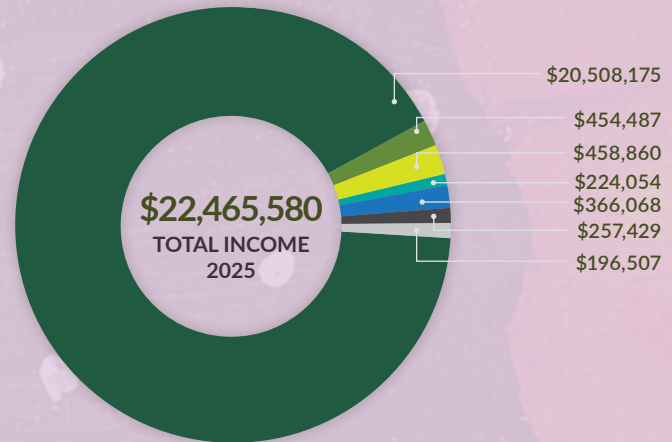
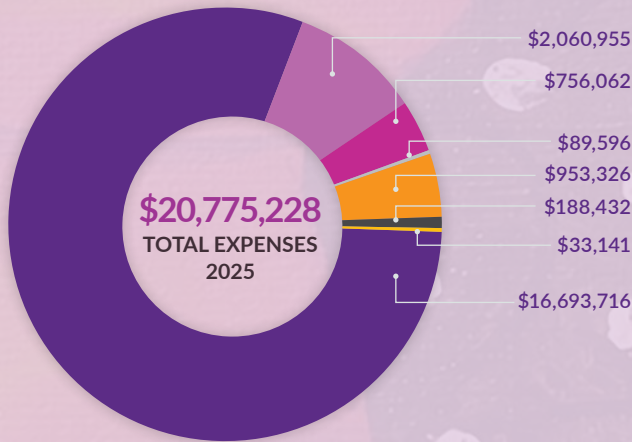

While many of the individuals we serve receive funding from state and federal sources to pay for services and support, Langton Green, Inc. is not a state organization—we are a 501-C3 nonprofit organization with high standards of care and personalized services and support.

Our Annual Report offers a snapshot of our success. In FY 2025, both revenue and expenses increased as expected as we grow in the excellence of our staff and supports for the individuals we serve.

The board of directors of Langton Green engage an Independent Certified Public Accounting firm to audit our financial statements annually. Our auditors issued an Unqualified Opinion for FY 2024. Employees Give-Back Program

Our employees take the phrase “give back” to heart. They strive for excellence and are generous contributors. They have donated nearly \$81,000 since the program’s founding in 2017. Our staff contributed nearly \$13,000 in 2025, nearly the same in 2024, up from \$12,507 in 2023, and distributed this back to people in their care. Give-Back Grants are used in many ways: to pay high dental bills, for special requests in our homes, like larger televisions, exercise equipment, outdoor furniture —to name a few. These funds help improve the quality of life for the individuals in our care.

Grants Fund Our Mission

In FY 2025, for the seventh year in a row, Langton Green applied for—and was awarded—several mission-centric grants. We are deeply grateful to our giving partners and grantors; they help us further our mission of ensuring dignity, opportunity, and community for all people. The support we received is being used in many ways: to grow Langton Learning, our virtual activities site; expand our garden spaces; and provide new plants, fencing, and feed. This support also funds unplanned medical expenses for livestock and the delivery of fresh vegetables to our group homes. We're making good use of the renovations to our rancher, including an industrial kitchen and a sustainable wash station. We've expanded our woodland garden space and will launch a "Mini-Farm" for children. Thanks to our state and county arts councils, murals by a local artist welcome visitors to the Farm.

Thanks to funding that supports our Vocational Program at the Langton Green Community Farm individuals:

- Harvested produce and eggs continuously for 30 weeks.
- Worked more than 2,000 hrs. at competitive wages at the Farm and in the community.
- Collected more than 13,000 eggs.
- We have pigs, new baby goats, and a chicken flock of 36 birds!

Thanks to ongoing support from a Nature Sacred grant and help from volunteers, we have new outdoor spaces for performances. We were one of five winners (\$100,000 each in 2023) in the Kubota Hometown Proud Grant Program and in FY 2025 we continued to put this to good use. We completed construction on a state-bond funded, triple-bay steel garage. Our new "Mini-Farm" will offer children access to our community garden to learn about local sustainable agricultural production.

We continue to celebrate a milestone: Langton Green's 40th and the Farm's 10th anniversary.



Finding One's Voice

At Langton Green we encourage each individual to find his or her voice. Many of these individuals have never had anyone listen to them in their lives. In FY 2025, we offered many opportunities for finding one's voice and learning to advocate for oneself. Our Health Matters Advocacy Group empowers individuals to make suggestions, resolve conflicts, and respond to training on issues such as abuse. Each person develops self-advocacy skills and learns to communicate his or her needs in a positive way. We also provide connection through virtual activities for those who choose to remain home or are isolated due to the closure of day programs. This can take our snow days to a new level of fun.

Through Touchstones—a reading-based discussion group—each individual is listened to and treated with respect. One of our individuals who receives services, JK, found her voice through Touchstones. She lowered the stress in her life by learning to communicate productively with staff and other individuals at Langton. JK learned that her voice matters. Once she was heard, she could participate in finding a positive solution to her challenges.

When Wes moved to Langton Green our family was in upheaval. Our mom has just died. It was a full year before we could really become involved in his life again. When we reconnected, **we saw how much he had grown into himself!** Wes had blossomed! We have Langton Green to thank for that.”

Growing Together

Langton Green in the Community

At Langton Green we are proud of our high standards and commitment to excellence. We continue to exceed state and federal standards of care for our industry. At Langton Green we believe in community and embrace our vision of self-advocacy, dignity, opportunity, and community for all people. At Langton Green we pride ourselves on the recognition we receive for our excellence and our relationship with the wider community.

- People receiving services contributed more than 1,500 volunteer hours annually in 2020, in the local community for organizations such as the Annapolis Lighthouse, Chesapeake Bay Foundation, Maryland Food Bank, and churches. In 2022, we volunteered despite reduced opportunities post-pandemic and in 2023, we contributed 1,346 hours. In 2024, we contributed 300 hours in the community and in 2025 we reached nearly 1,500 hours. We are happy to be helping in the community again!
- Thanks to our staff, individuals receiving services participate in more than 6,000 free or low-cost outings in the community annually. We visit libraries and take day trips in the community to parks, museums, and more!

In everyday life, I've learned to appreciate what's around us: the smell of the warm earth, each plant as it is growing, each animal as it is going about its daily routine. I know a lot of the individuals at the Farm do notice these things and through my poetry, I'm trying to help them record it.

Langton Learning: Our Virtual Garden

We're learning together!

Langton Learning is an exciting new virtual activities site for our community. At least twice a week, individuals in our care join virtual activities of all kinds. Each activity typically attracts 20-30 individuals. This is a growing resource that features everything from fitness, cooking, yoga, book clubs, and coffee chats to travel tours and Farm visits. These activities reduce isolation and build community. The individuals we support learn and have fun together. We've discovered that we really enjoy connecting with others in virtual activities—and prefer them to traditional day programs. Langton Learning's virtual activities are created with the same care and excellence that Langton Green's professional, dedicated team gives to its programs and supports for individuals.



Having mixed schedules is key, so people can have a mix of in-person and virtual activities, employment, volunteering, as well as downtime at home if they want it. **Everyone should have the opportunity to build their schedule the way they want.**
